I am happy to report that our technology program is in the initial stages of implementing 30 Chromebooks and 30 laptops during instruction.

In addition, San Miguel School was one of four schools chosen to participate in Onward Readers, a reading pilot program for grades kindergarten through three. The program is aligned with the Common Core State Standards and designed using research-based strategies that are modified by datadriven decisions. Onward Readers, which is sponsored by the John H. and Cindy Lee Smet Foundation in collaboration with the Department of Catholic Schools, supplies all resources, offers professional development for our teachers, and provides support from a program director and reading specialist.



Our school is blessed with board members, foundations that support Catholic education, friends, and "guardian angels" who support us in prayer, scholarships, and kind donations. We are committed to our mission and excited for what's to come.
